

Request For Pre-Qualification Of Bidders Commencing With Forthcoming Public Work Bid

REQUEST FOR PRE-QUALIFICATION OF BIDDERS COMMENCING WITH FORTHCOMING PUBLIC WORK BID

[Pre-qualification procedure begun prior to RFP]

Notice is hereby given that the City of Beaufort has determined that all bidders on the Henry C. Chambers Waterfront Park Reconstruction Project to be undertaken by the City of Beaufort must be pre-qualified prior to submitting a bid on that project. It is mandatory that all Contractors who intend to submit a bid, fully complete the pre-qualification questionnaire, provide all materials requested herein, and be approved by the City of Beaufort to be on the final qualified Bidders list. No bid will be accepted from a Contractor that has failed to comply with these requirements. If two or more business entities submit a bid as part of a Joint Venture, or expect to submit a bid as part of a Joint Venture, each entity within the Joint Venture must be separately qualified to bid. The last date to submit a fully completed questionnaire is **April 22, 2005**.

This project will renovate an approximately 5.88 acre (256,184 square feet) urban waterfront park located in the Beaufort Historic District. The site is located on the Beaufort River south of Bay Street and west of Carteret Street. The urban waterfront park was originally constructed between 1977 and 1978, and is used for hosting a variety of community events throughout the year. The park is popular and is well used by visitors and the community alike. Shops and business abut the northern boundary of the park while surface parking lots are provided on the east and west ends of the park. The southern boundary of the park is made by way of a bulkhead along the Beaufort River (Intracoastal Waterway). Docks for boats are located in the westerly portion of the site.

The urban waterfront park requires varying degrees of repairs and/or cleaning to the existing sea wall including expansion joints, tie backs, sheet pile, fenders, cleats, and bollards/chains. The storm water drainage system must be replaced and reconfigured. New storm penetrations to the existing sea wall bulkhead will be required. Electrical transformers are to be relocated and new electrical systems must be installed. The existing rest rooms and playground are to be demolished. A new roof is required for the

Pavilion and a new restrooms/maintenance building will be constructed. Charles Street and Scott Street will be reconfigured to accommodate new traffic patterns. New walks, walls, and planters will consist of “tabby” and/or brick pavers, in a combination of patterns. Existing brick pavers will be removed, cleaned, and reused in the new configuration. A new playground will be constructed. Existing large trees will be preserved and supplemented with new landscaping and a new irrigation system. Site materials/furniture including benches, tables, chairs, swings, pavers, and light poles/luminaries-must be installed. The work must be sequenced to allow the hosting of the Water Festival to occur in areas of the park in July 2005, and full park access for the Contractor can resume August 2005. It is anticipated the work will be substantially complete by May 2006. Cost of construction is anticipated to be between \$4 and \$7 million.

Contractors are encouraged to submit pre-qualification packages as soon as possible, so that they may be notified of omissions of information to be remedied or of their pre-qualification status well in advance of the bid advertisement for this project.

Answers to questions contained in the attached questionnaire, information about current bonding capacity, notarized statement from surety, and the most recent reviewed or audited financial statements, with accompanying notes and supplemental information, are required. The City of Beaufort will use these documents as the basis of rating Contractors in respect to the size and scope of the Henry C. Chambers Waterfront Park Reconstruction Project, and select which Contractors are qualified to bid. The City of Beaufort reserves the right to check other sources available. The City of Beaufort decision will be based on objective evaluation criteria.

The City of Beaufort reserves the right to adjust, increase, limit, suspend or rescind the pre-qualification rating based on subsequently learned information. Contractors whose rating changes sufficient to disqualify them will be notified, and given an opportunity for a hearing consistent with the hearing procedures described below for appealing a pre-qualification rating.

While it is the intent of the pre-qualification questionnaire and documents required therewith to assist the City of Beaufort in determining bidder responsibility prior to bid and to aid the City of Beaufort in selecting the lowest responsible bidder, neither the fact of pre-qualification, nor any pre-qualification rating, will preclude the City of Beaufort from a post-bid consideration and determination of whether a bidder has the quality, fitness, capacity and experience to satisfactorily perform the proposed work, and has demonstrated the requisite trustworthiness.

The pre-qualification packages should be submitted under seal and marked “CONFIDENTIAL” to City Manager, City of Beaufort, P.O. Drawer 1167, Beaufort, SC 29901. Contractors may submit pre-qualification packages by mail or during regular working hours on any day that the offices of the City of Beaufort are open. Contractors who submit a complete pre-qualification package will be notified of their qualification status no later than ten (10) business days after submission of the information.

The pre-qualification packages (questionnaire answers and financial statements) submitted by Contractors are not public records and are not open to public inspection. All information provided will be kept confidential to the extent permitted by law. However, the contents may be disclosed to third parties for purpose of verification, or investigation of substantial allegations, or in the appeal hearing. The names of contractors applying for pre-qualification status shall be public records subject to disclosure, and the first page of the questionnaire will be used for that purpose.

Each questionnaire must be signed under penalty of perjury in the manner designated at the end of the form, by an individual who has the legal authority to bind the Contractor on whose behalf that person is signing. If any information provided by a Contractor becomes inaccurate, the Contractor must

immediately notify the City of Beaufort and provide updated accurate information in writing, under penalty of perjury.

The City of Beaufort reserves the right to waive minor irregularities and omissions in the information contained in the pre-qualification application submitted, to make all final determinations, and to determine at any time that the pre-qualification procedures will not be applied to a specific future public works project.

The City of Beaufort may refuse to grant pre-qualification where the requested information and materials are not provided, or not provided by the date specified in first paragraph. There is no appeal from a refusal for an incomplete or late application, but re-application for a later project is permitted. The closing time for bids will not be changed in order to accommodate supplementation of incomplete submissions, or late submissions.

Where a timely and completed application results in a rating below that necessary to pre-qualify, an appeal can be made. An appeal is begun by the Contractor delivering notice to The City of Beaufort of its appeal of the decision with respect to its pre-qualification rating, no later than ten business days prior to the closing time for the receipt of bids for this public works project. Without a timely appeal, the Contractor waives any and all rights to challenge the decision of the City of Beaufort, whether by administrative process, judicial process or any other legal process or proceeding.

If the Contractor gives the required notice of appeal and requests a hearing, the hearing shall be conducted so that it is concluded no later than five business days after the City of Beaufort's receipt of the notice of appeal, and no later than five business days prior to the last date for the receipt of bids on the project. The hearing shall be an informal process conducted by a panel to whom the City of Beaufort has delegated responsibility to hear such appeals (the "Appeals Panel"). At or prior to the hearing, the Contractor will be advised of the basis for the City of Beaufort's pre-qualification determination. The Contractor will be given the opportunity to present information and present reasons in opposition to the rating. Within one day after the conclusion of the hearing, the Appeals Panel will render its decision, which will be final. It is the intention of the City of Beaufort that the date for the submission and opening of bids will not be delayed or postponed to allow for completion of an appeal process.

Note: A Contractor may be found not pre-qualified for bidding on a specific public works contract to be let by Public Entity, or on all contracts to be let by Public Entity until the Contractor meets Public Entity's requirements. In addition, a Contractor may be found not pre-qualified for either:

- (1) Omission of requested information or
- (2) Falsification of information
